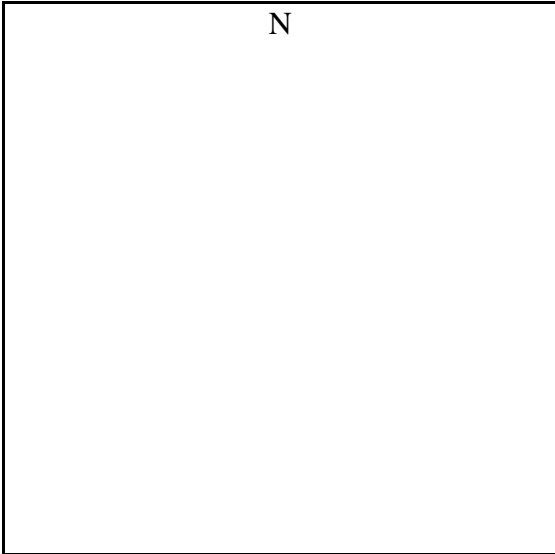

Terms and Conditions

Objective:

- To assist landowners in providing a clean, reliable supply of water for livestock. The program will protect surface water and/or groundwater by restricting or removing access by livestock to waterways.

Eligibility and Conditions:

- Project land must be within the Intermountain Conservation District.
- Project must remove or restrict livestock from flowing waterways
- Landowners must be in good financial standing with the IMCD.

Funding Conditions:

- Funding for livestock watering will be cost shared in the ratio of 40% applicant and 60% IMCD to a maximum of \$1,500 IMCD funding.
- Eligible costs for a summer or winter watering system will include the pump, water trough, power source (except hydro), pipeline, hoses and associated accessories.

The Land Owner Shall:

- Provide to the IMCD a plan showing the location of the proposed water supply project and how the project will be incorporated into the existing or planned farm operation and water source.
- Be responsible for ordering and paying for project supplies.
- Provide access for inspection or evaluation by the Board and/or IMCD staff at any reasonable time.
- Consent to signage indicating the landowner's participation in the program.
- Failure of landowner to meet Landowner responsibilities may negate him/her from other Conservation District programs.
- Indemnity and save harmless the IMCD, their agents, engineers, servants and or employees from any liability that may result from this project.

The Conservation District Shall:

- Provide assistance to supervise and ensure proper installation of the pipeline and/or watering systems.
- Not be responsible for connecting pasture pipeline to existing pipeline or pump.
- Not be held responsible for future costs of maintenance of the installed pipeline, or damage to the pipeline resulting from agricultural practices.
- Reserve the right to reasonable access to project areas for tours or to inspect the use of the installed pipeline.
- All projects are to be approved by IMCD prior to construction and are subject to available funding.
- The Conservation district shall determine application priority in consultation with sub-district, Board and staff.
- IMCD reserves the right for reasonable access to inspection and to promote the program
- All projects are to be approved by IMCD prior to construction and are subject to available funding.
- The CD shall determine application priority in consultation with sub-district, Board and staff.
