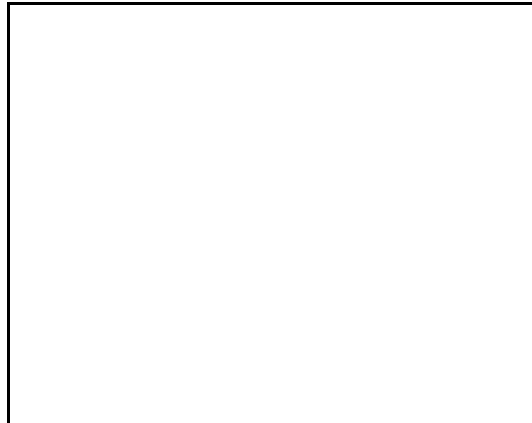

Terms and Conditions

Objective:

- As IMCD is seeing higher peak flows in its waterways, the goal of this program is to create short-term water retention areas in order to reduce downstream water flows and the subsequent erosion and infrastructure damage. Projects could involve engineered structures or simply the re-establishment of a historical wetland.

Eligibility and Conditions:

- Land must be within the Intermountain Conservation District.
- Applicant must be in good standing with the conservation district.
- Signed consent forms from any upstream or downstream landowners affected by the project is required before construction.

Assistance:

- Water retention projects will be cost shared on an case-by case basis. The IMCD reserves the right to determine the percentage of landowner contribution required on retention projects and may decline any project if the cost share is not agreed upon.

General Information:

- All projects are to be approved by the IMCD prior to construction and are subject to available funding.
- The Conservation District shall determine application priority in consultation with Sub-district, Board and Staff.
- All necessary approvals will need to be in place prior to construction.
- Engineering and technical service and financial assistance for project design, construction and repairs will be subject to the availability of funding and/or staff. The Intermountain Conservation District reserves the right to establish priorities for providing such services and assistance.
- IMCD shall inspect the retention area annually for up to five years, and monitoring will continue for the duration of the agreement with the landowner's assistance. Any repairs will be subject to the same cost-share as the original project.
- IMCD reserves the right for reasonable access to the project site for inspection and to promote the program.
- Indemnify and save harmless the Intermountain Conservation District, their agents, engineers, servants and /or employees from any liability that may result from this project.
